It is the Lord's hand at work all around us. Easter is coming!

FROM THE INFORMATION TASK GROUP

April 2012

Dear friends,

It has been a few weeks since Session met with you in the Covenant Center to review information with you about some critical issues that our denomination faces this year. These issues include Amendment 10-A and several related overtures that face our Church, the Washington Presbytery and the General Assembly.

Since the meeting in January, Session has formed an Information Task Group that will provide information to you about these issues as the information comes along and becomes credible. The members of this Information Task Group are: Dottie and Charlie Bowers, Donna Carlisle, Debbie Evans, Rachel and Tom Gladden, Joe Jefferys, Jonathan Pachter and Sara Smith. Dr. Broberg will be offering us his advice and guidance as we work through these issues.

New issues keep coming up that this Task Group is monitoring, and the Group is watching various information sources. Recently, some members of the Task Group attended a Presbytery-sponsored meeting to learn more about how some churches and congregations are proposing to address Amendment 10-A and its related offshoot issues. This meeting did not provide any new concrete information about this issue, but we were there listening and to report back to you.

This Task Group will be reporting to Session in April to describe the information that it has learned. Then our plan is to hold another meeting to provide current information to the congregation on these matters. This second open information meeting is planned to be held on Wednesday, April 25, 2012, in the Covenant Center. A light dinner will be provided, followed by the information meeting. Please sign up at the Welcome Center if you will be able to join us for dinner starting at 6:00 p.m. on the 25th.

The following gently used book was donated by the family of Nancy Brown.

The Life of Jesus by Frederick Buechner. Buechner is a very well known Christian writer. In this beautiful book, he writes an essay on the life of Jesus as seen through the eyes of countless painters, sculptors and artisans from early Christian to Modern times. There are six chapters – Annunciation, Nativity, Ministry, Last Supper, Crucifixion and Resurrection. Lee Boltin is the talented photographer of the 150 color illustrations.

The following gently used book was donated by Connie Hornickel.

West with the Night by Beryl Markham. The author was born in England in 1902 but was taken to East Africa in 1906 by her father. She spent her childhood playing with the native children. She also apprenticed with her father as a trainer and breeder of racehorses. In the 1930's, she became an African bush pilot and in 1936, she became the first person to fly solo across the Atlantic from east to west. Those who read it think it's a wonderful book.

The following gently used books were donated anonymously. The Library Committee thanks the donors.

From Anger to Zion: An Alphabet of Faith by Porter Taylor. The author is an Episcopal priest, teacher and college professor. The series of essays were first used as sermons. The topics are arranged in alphabetical order. They include Anger, Blessed, Cross, Evangelism, Forgiveness, Judgment, Prodigal and Transfiguration, to name a few. Each one teaches something to the reader and provides ample ideas for discussion.

Home to Big Stone Gap by Adriana Trigiani. The main character of this novel is Ave Maria MacChesney who was born and still lives in Big Stone Gap, VA. Ave Maria's life is turned upside down by several unexpected events. She finds that she has to reinvent her world, her life, and herself, whether she wants to or not. Trouble the Water by Nicole Seitz. This book is considered a faith fiction novel. The main character, Honor, a woman in her mid 40's, arrives at St. Anne's Isle off the SC coast with her life in tatters. A group of local women rescue her and love her back to health. There are 2 other characters that help to tell Honor's compelling story.

The Color of Water: A Black Man's Tribute to His White Mother by James McBride. The author was raised in Brooklyn's Red Hood Projects. When he was an adult, he finally persuaded his mother to tell her story. She was a rabbi's daughter, born in Poland and raised in the South. She fled to Harlem, married a black man, founded a Baptist church, and put 12 children through college. The New York Times says "The triumph of the book...is that race and religion are transcended in these interwoven histories by family love, the sheer force of a mother's will, and her unshakable insistence that only two things really mattered: school and church." The book was on the bestseller list for over 2 years. (James McBride is also the author of a book about WWII, Miracle at St. Anna, that was made into a major motion picture a few years ago.)

How Far to Bethlehem? by Norah Lofts. Lofts does a remarkable job of weaving together the story of Mary and Joseph and the isolated stories of the three wise men. She also develops a personal story about the innkeeper, one shepherd and Herod. Her writing skills give the story of the coming of the Messiah a color, depth and dimension that will stay with the reader. (*Recommended by Barb Knight*)

The Gift by Richard Paul Evans. Nathan Hurst is a Tourette's – suffering security chief for a retail chain. When he gets snowed in at an airport, he offers to share his hotel suite with a stranded woman and her two children. The young boy has leukemia. He also possesses a very special gift that the mother wants hidden from the public. The story is a lesson in faith, endurance and healing.

<u>The Christmas Cookie Club</u> by Ann Pearlman. Each year, on the first Monday of December, 12 close friends get together for a cookie exchange. Everyone has to bring a dish, a bottle of wine, and their stories. As with any group, there are stories of struggles and triumphs. The novel celebrates courage and joy in spite of hard times as well as the importance of women's friendships.

A Treasury of Miracles for Women: True Stories of God's Presence Today by Karen Kingsbury. Included in this book are 12 or more true stories about wondrous events in the lives of ordinary women. Each one reminds us that with faith, hope is never lost.
