PARISH NURSE CORNER SUMMER 2019

Blood Pressure Screenings

Hypertension is a silent killer. Part of a healthy lifestyle includes maintaining a blood pressure within acceptable limits determined by your health care provider. In between those physician office visits, monitor your blood pressure by taking advantage of screenings offered the first Sunday of every month in the Receptionist Office after each service. All blood pressure results are confidential. Blood pressures are also taken in the Parish Nurse Office in Room 302 most Sunday mornings.

Practice Sun Safety this summer. Wear sunscreen everyday, Broadspectrum sunscreens block UVA and UVB rays, both of which are harmful. Apply liberally and reapply every 2 hours or immediately after swimming. Don't forget the kids! Additional protection tactics from the sun include staying in the shade especially between 10am and 4pm, wearing a wide-brimmed hat, wearing sunglasses and covering up with dark or bright-colored tightly woven clothing. Charity Navigator

The Church of the Covenant, through the Mission Committee, supports various mission activities in our community and the world. The Mission Committee is intent upon ensuring that Mission resources are applied to meaningful beneficiaries that feed the hungry, house the homeless, help people overcome obstacles in their lives, and assist those who have lost hope.

One of the tools available to the Committee to ascertain the performance and effectiveness of donation recipients is the Charity Navigator. Founded in 2001, Charity Navigator has become the nation's largest and most-utilized evaluator of charities. Its team of professional analysts has examined tens of thousands of non-profit financial documents. Using its unbiased, objective, numbers-based rating system Charity Navigator is able to assess over 9,000 of America's worthy charities.

Specifically, Charity Navigator's rating system examines two broad areas of a charity's performance; their Financial Health and their Accountability & Transparency. Their ratings show donors how efficiently they believe a charity will use the donor support. The information provided allows charitable donors to make intelligent giving decisions.

Charities are rated from one star to four stars with the latter being the highest rating. Charity Navigator provides details about how charities spend the money that is provided to them by donors. It also issues alerts if charities are subject to adverse reporting. Many charities are not large enough to be evaluated using the Charity Navigator system. In those cases Charity Navigator will provide a copy of the charity's IRS Form 990 which shows how the charity gets its income and how it uses it to support its cause.

Charity Navigator's website is found at www.charitynavigator.org. It is a 501 (c) (3) public charity itself. It provides the church, and individual givers, with a guide enabling them to apply charitable donations to recipients that will use the gifts to best advantage.

UPDATE FROM BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

Hello, and blessings from the boiler room. The Buildings and Grounds Department has been extremely busy with updates to the security of the church. The cameras are functioning and have already answered some questions related to incidents/situations. The security of the doors and elevator in the Commons is now fully operational and we are becoming accustomed to it a little more each day. The re-keying of interior doors is 75% complete and projected completion date is July 1, 2019. The "Knoxbox" which contains keys for emergency responders to enter the building has been installed.

With these upgrades access to the building is limited but security is greatly enhanced. It is more important than ever to schedule room usage with Debi so that we can use our facility in a productive way and maintain a high level of security.

A great deal of time, thought and expense has been invested in this project. The matter of security is a concern to all and we look forward to partnering with the congregation as these changes and upgrades are implemented.
